Middle School Tuition Information

Because a bilingual education is one of the most valuable gifts a child can receive, we strive to keep tuition costs low. DMIS remains one of the most affordable private schools in the metro Denver region. Most of its funding comes from student tuition.

Tuition Rates for the 2012-13 Academic Year

Middle School: \$14,000

Tuition Payment Plans

With the enrollment contract is due 1/9th of the total tuition amount (plus the Work Bond Deposit and/or Tuition Refund Insurance Premium, if applicable).

One Payment

The tuition deposit is deducted from the total tuition and the balance is due by August 1st, 2012 or on the first day of the month in which the student begins attending DMIS.

Monthly Payments

DMIS breaks the annual tuition into nine equal payments, the first of which is due with the enrollment contract. The tuition deposit is deducted from the total tuition is divided into equal payments based on the date the student begins at DMIS. Tuition payments are due the first day of each month, commencing September 1, 2012 and ending May 1, 2013 (excluding February 2013). Purchase of the Tuition Refund Insurance Plan is required if a monthly payment plan is selected.

Tuition Refund Insurance Plan

Tuition insurance is available at an additional charge of 3.3% of the tuition amount. Families opting for the monthly payment plan are required by the insurance provider to purchase Tuition Refund Insurance. Tuition insurance is optional for families who choose a one payment plan. Tuition insurance is due with the enrollment contract.

Please refer to the tuition Refund Plan brochure included in the enrollment packet for additional information. The plan is administered by A.W.G. Dewar, Inc. and more information is available at tuitionrefundplan.com. The plan is billed through DMIS in July or the first day of the month in which the student starts at DMIS.

Work Bond Deposit - \$400 per family

The Work Bond Deposit is designed to keep tuition costs low and strengthen the volunteer program at DMIS. The deposit is paid when a family enters the school community. If families complete and log 20 hours of service during the academic year, the deposit rolls over to the next year. If the Work Bond requirements are not met, the deposit is forfeited and must be resubmitted with the enrollment contract for the subsequent year. During the families final year at the school and provided the Work Bond requirements are met, the deposit can be refunded. The request for refund must be made in writing in the Work Bond Book in the front office by June 30, 2013. Requests will be processed no later than September 1, 2013.

Activity Fee- \$650 per student

This fee encompasses many of the individual costs traditionally incurred throughout the course of a school year. It simplifies our processes and covers the following items: participation in the Breckenridge Outdoor Education trip at the beginning of the school year, all field trips, classroom events/school supplies, one yearbook per student/one yearbook ad per class, DMIS wear (required for special events, safety requirement for field trips). This fee will also cover the cost of the iPad, which is an integral part of DMIS' middle school curriculum.
